Through social development, it seeks to remove barriers, encourage active participation and empower marginalised or historically excluded communities. Ultimately, social development seeks to build a more just and equitable society, where every individual has the opportunity and support needed to thrive, and where diversity is valued as an enriching asset for the common good.

International Youth Day, commemorated annually on 12th August, was established by the United Nations General Assembly in 1999 to raise awareness of the challenges facing young people globally.

These will not only enable them to adapt to climate change, but also to contribute to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals.

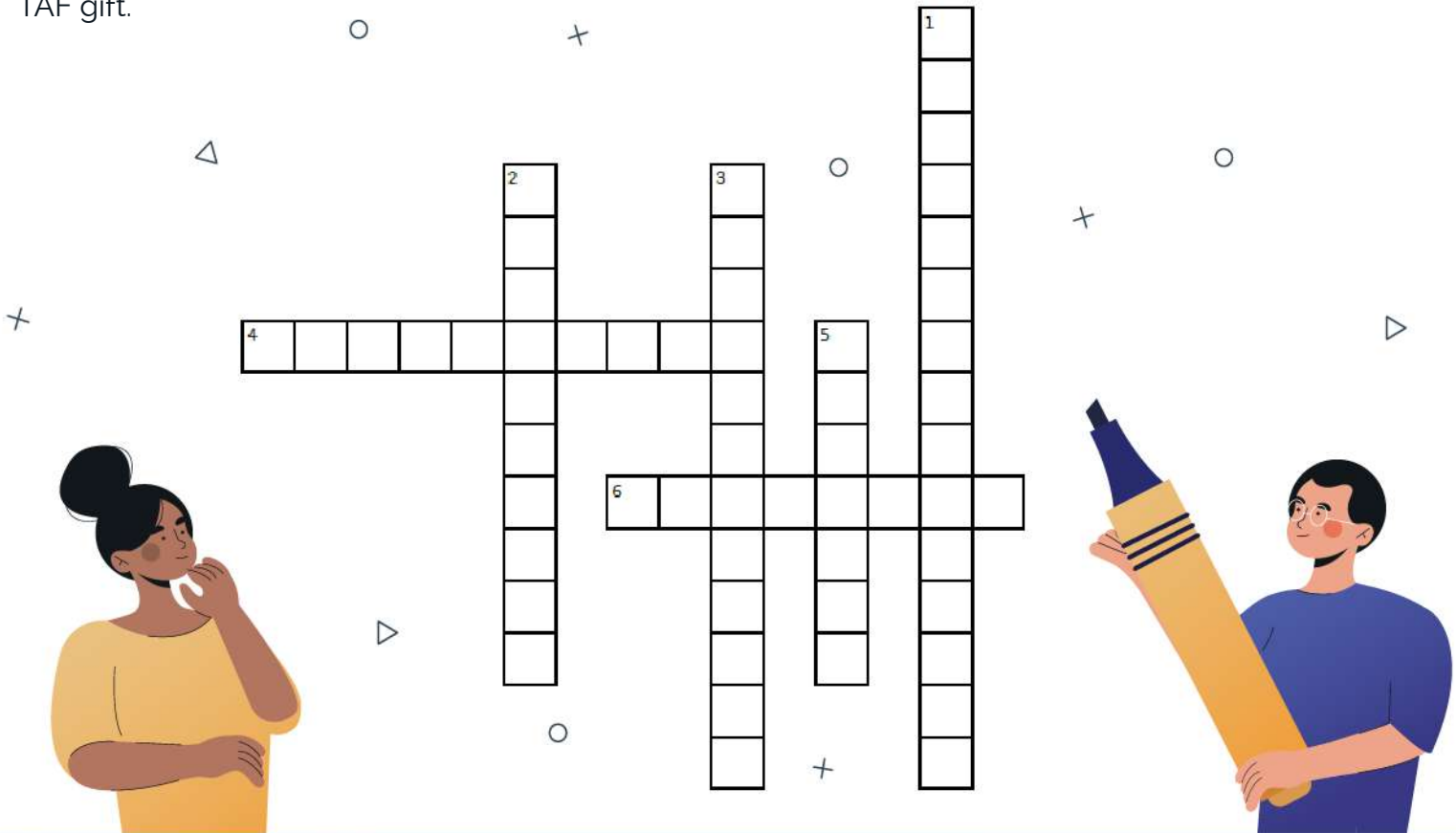

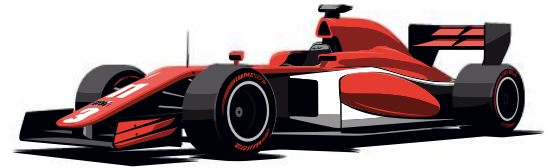
Civil Protection Training Days College 2024

Did you know that the Formula 1 classic "The British Grand Prix" is the oldest in history?



Silverstone Track hosts some of the world's finest motor racing and it was not until 1987 that the venue became a permanent fixture.

Silverstone was built from a perimeter road to an airfield in 1942 during the Second World War.

Valentino Rossi is the record MotoGP winner at Silverstone Circuit with eight victories - four in the premier class.

-  The circuit is 5.891 kilometres long, with 18 corners, eight of which are left-handers and ten right-handers. The track is 15 metres wide and its longest straight is 770 metres long.
-  Historic corners include Maggotts, Abbey and Becketts.
-  Lap record: 1:28.617 (Checo Perez in 2021).

Dimensiones e importancia

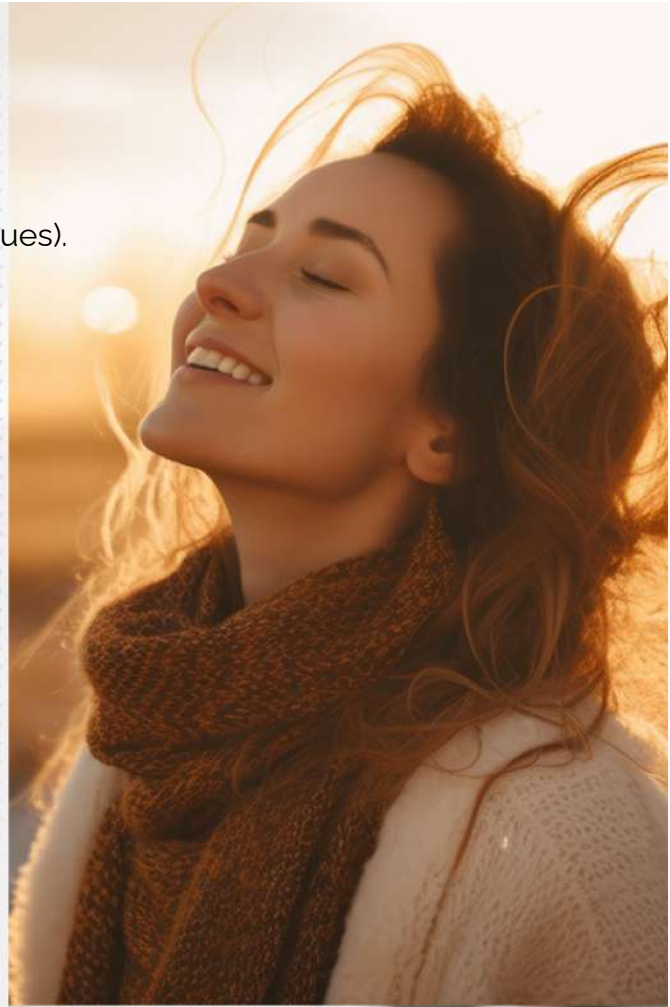
The IDGs are divided into five dimensions, representing the different aspects of inner development. The IDGs are important because they show us a way to develop our human potential and contribute to sustainable development.
